The Misunderstood Duck finds a home in Front Royal

Members of A Hard Act to Follow Theatre Group present the story of an outcast

The Community Fellowship Hall behind Front Royal's First Baptist Church was full of wonderfully costumed farm animals, an audience of friends, family and fans of live dramatic performances who had gathered on Sunday, July 28, to enjoy the show called The Misunderstood Duck.

The play is an adaptation of Hans

Christian Andersen's "The Ugly Duckling" written and produced by Winnie Ehlinger and directed by Ann Masch. Horses, cows, pigs, ducks, foxes, a farmer, chickens, a turtle, sheep, butterfly, swan, a wise owl and a sneaky cat, and performed with skill and enthusiasm by the A Hard Act to Follow Theatre Group.

The cast of characters patiently waited for the opening, but their excitement when it began was catching.

Everyone listened to a brief announcement by Winnie and Ann, as they explained the information on the program that read, "Because you may have difficulty hearing or understanding some of our enthusiastic actors, you will hear those lines echoed by volunteers."

These are helpful folks who are said to "shadow" players who have difficulty speaking or being heard and their voices carry the story along, allowing the actors the ability to focus on acting

out their parts so people in the audience can follow the dialogue.

But only a few of the actors need the shadowing technique, and it doesn't cause any disruption in the flow of the story. Also, "All of the actors who have lines really like speaking the lines," Ann noted.

The fact that they could use shadowing opened up a whole world of theater for them and is a large part of why the troupe was created and how it could be developed.

They originally formed after Ann was inspired by a movie she had seen on TV, showing hearing impaired actors in a play using shadowing.

Ann saw how it could open the way for their own people.

"I told Winnie I'd love to have a theatre group here," she said.

And so, "A Hard Act to Follow Theatre Group" was born and now Ann's two daughters and one of Winnie's sons are actors and her other son

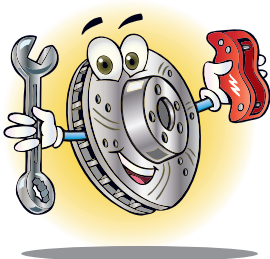

works on technical aspects and with the backstage crew in their productions.

“We wanted to wake people up about the special needs acting ‘world’ and we love an audience!” Ann said and appeared to have no regrets about the decision to go ahead with their dream.

“These guys are some of the kindest, most respectful and compassionate people I’ve ever known. I love the hours spent rehearsing almost as much as the finished performance. I’m so fortunate to be included in A Hard Act to Follow,” she said.

And Winnie, when contacted, said, “I couldn’t have done this without Ann.”

She was happy to add more information about the group, saying that their number is growing, having added five more players for this play, and would like to add more characters. She also said that they are a little short staffed and are looking for more volunteers.

They plan to have a table at the Festival of Leaves this year and will sell wooden turtle magnets made by members of Blue Ridge Opportunities.

Auditions for their next production are being held now for the next production in October called “It’s the Great Pumpkin, Charlie Brown!” Shows are tentatively scheduled for Saturday, October 26 at 11:30 a.m., and Monday, October 28 at 7:00 p.m., both at Samuels Public Library.

was evident in how smoothly everything carried through.

Obvious, as well, was the pleasure the actors and “shadowers” felt to be entertaining the audience.

The first scene of The Misunderstood Duck opens up on a farm. A chicken sits lamenting that the farmer always takes her eggs. Three “duckling” eggs are waiting to hatch, one egg looking distinctly different from the other two, and mother and father duck exhibiting varying emotions during the wait.

During the play, the actors exhibited some conditions in short scenes that, in addition to their words and/or actions, were defined and shared with the audience by an ingenious method.

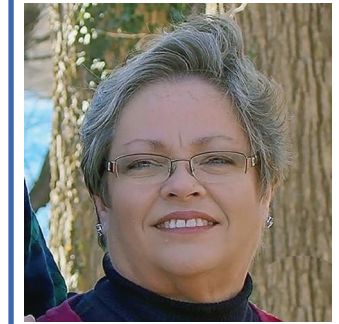
Along with each of these scenes, the “Sneaky Barn Cat” walked across

was displayed by father duck pacing and worried about what kind of a parent he will be, and mother duck expressed her nervousness in a different way with ocd (obsessive-compulsive disorder).

As the adult pigs assured him that he had been wonderful with their autistic piglet, the cat showed up with the autism sign.

When the misunderstood duck a.k.a. “the ugly duckling/swan” hatched, the ducklings pointed out

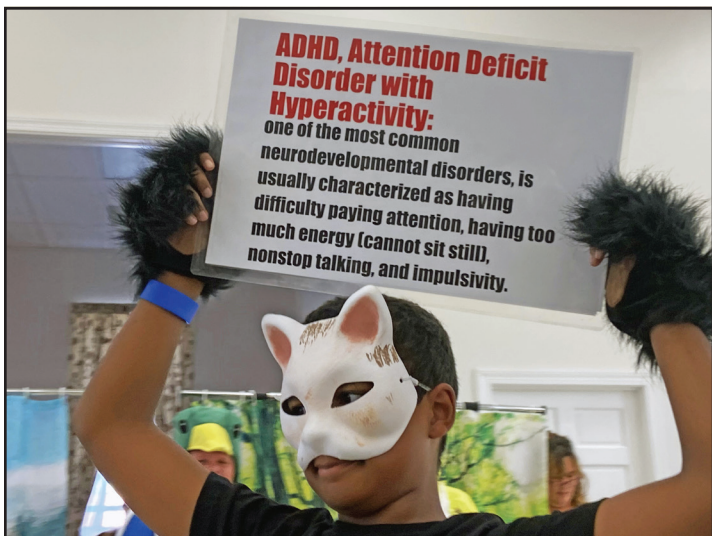
that “he couldn’t swim right away, he looks different and sounds different than us,” and he left the nest crying and encountered a variety of farm animals with other characteristics that had caused them to endure ridicule or rejection.

He found a character with Down Syndrome, another who was in the middle of an epileptic seizure and others. Some of the other characters gave him support and encouragement, though.

As he journeyed on, those encounters caused the sign parade to continue and define traits like clinical depression, elopement, attention-deficit hyperactivity disorder, Tourettes Syndrome, bipolar disorder, traumatic brain injury and agoraphobia.

But the main message throughout the play was expressed by the swan when he was lamenting about rejection from the ducklings.

"See the able, not the label!" he in-

sisted.

So, happily, his story ended well when he molted, the gray feathers turned into gorgeous white ones and he encountered the swan he saw earlier who he had told, "You are the most beautiful creature I've ever seen!"

When he saw her again, he said, "I can't believe I'm a swan."

"I tried to tell you!" was her response.

The play ended on that high note,

In April this year Director Teresa (Terre) Jenkins and Assistant Director Tina "Songbird" Johnson opened the unique Stone Branch Center for the Arts at 114 East Main Street in Front Royal with the wish to offer an arts experience to people of all ages.

"We love being on Main Street. It's so fun," Tina said and added, "Terre and I love this town."

"We're just getting started, and haven't quite hit our stride yet," Terre says.

But they have an impressive list of

upcoming offerings for this autumn along with future additions to them.

Included, besides a 10 X 10 art show, are a Yuletide Fine Arts Market, workshops, open studios, watercolor, papier mâché, drawing, writing sculpture classes, live theatre, open mike nights and many more classes and events.

"We want to add more classes, with possibly a live figure drawing private group. We do have a dance instructor and may add movement, dance and improv classes in the foreseeable future and maybe will do film screening," said Terre.

Tina describes herself as an ac-

poems is set up along with stations with art materials. A card exchange box holds cards made and donated from people who used the stamps and colored them for others to take and then make their own to add to the supply.

Terre specializes in printmaking, and in one of the classrooms a press is set up for Terre's work and classes. She hosts a social event called "Ink and Drink" for folks to learn and make

screen prints. This one is similar to the paint and sip events people have enjoyed in the past few years.

"This teaches some aspects of printmaking, the chance to learn materials and techniques and then print them to take home," she said. "It provides a (skill night) and then people can go and do art at home."

She is proficient in relief, drypoint etching and screen printing, and is willing to share her expertise.

Students who want to make a career in the arts can come to the center to

confer with Terre, who has a successful history of helping youth move forward with their goals.

She specializes in helping teenage art students create a portfolio to submit to art schools or college and has seen students go on to New York University, Rhode Island School of Design, Cornell and the Pratt Institute.

She gave a brief description of a design project geared toward children using a fairy tale called "Picture This."

"We do the Little Red Riding Hood story and start with design to give

them an understanding of color and movement and make the shape, but then go on to make some differences. For example, changing the purple hood or the blonde hair. We have students take the fairy tale and break it into shapes and colors to understand the basic elements, to take details out

and clear the mind, so they're not focusing on those.

Along with distilling the story into elements, she teaches how to discuss the work.

She explained that the goal was to ask them what the intention was, what could be changed, and how to look at

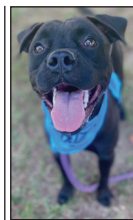

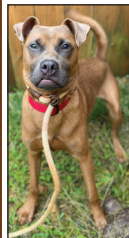

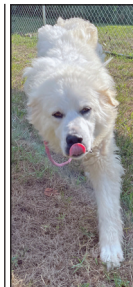

others' work without judgement and develop their language of noticing art.

"It teaches them to be analytical and develops their language skills, to give them a voice," she said. "They can say things like 'It's a good composition, or the colors are striking, or 'That swooshes,' not 'That sucks, or 'That's really bad.'"

She continued by observing that "Nothing we do is ever wasted. Everything is an opportunity for learning. All skills are in the toolbox, and everything contributes to well-rounded people."

Terre said she noticed that there are not a lot for seniors to do locally and said she likes working with them and with neuro-divergent people as she did when in college. They plan to make the place wheelchair accessible to serve the underserved.

"There are a lot of retired folks here who want things to do," she continued. "And we support all of the resources already in place but can fill in some of the gaps."

Tina said that there is a social component that people like.

"We want people to have a place

to come in," she said. "We unlock the doors, and the most wonderful people come in here. There's a wonderful energy here in the right place at the right time."

Three teenage interns work in the center, and Tina said that it's a safe place for them, as is the library. "It's wonderful. Kids go out of a small town but can come back here as a safe place."

More goals for the center are to support through the arts issues that people may have or are working through.

"We want to have art collectives, for example, cancer survivor groups, to help with them to explore their journey and communicate to others and their families about different parts of life. They can come together with people in fellowship, not as in art therapy, but to have an artistic outlet in types of art and in writing and performance."

"We'll be able to craft spaces and times for people and there are ways we can support them in our space. We have resources in our teaching staff and can contribute," Terre emphasized.

"It gives people a place to share their voice in conversations, and to be cathartic, being with people who understand their struggle and journey," Tina added. "We both have energy, and the vision will become clearer, and the community can help us carry through those. We make space for all. There are a lot of divides, but we will bring in anyone. All churches are welcome here."

She gave a little information about their background.

"I came here ten years ago after Northern Virginia exploded," she said. "Terre lived in Manassas until it was built up. What I love about moving to a small town is there's a different kind of energy here than Rockville or Manassas. It's heartwarming to be here. My parents were from the country."

Terre added to that sentiment. "People know each other, they show up and are helpful. We want to be a part of it and not foist it on anyone. We're here to serve. We really want to be an art hub in town. To make Front Royal an art destination, to attract tourist dollars and enrich people's art through all arts."

She commented that there are local arts that many people don't know about.

"Three to four nights a week, there's usually at least one musician on Main Street," she said. "And we can work together with them."

"Serving the community through the arts is more important than our art and skills. We want to fulfill the community's needs," Tina concluded.

CHICKEN GETS SPICY AND SMOKY



Everyone should have a go-to whole chicken recipe in their culinary repertoire. While roasting a chicken certainly gets the job done, it's hard to beat the flavor profile of a chicken cooked low and slow on a smoker. The chicken can be enjoyed right off the bone, and leftovers can be pulled or chopped to use in enchiladas, tacos, salads, and more.

Fire up the smoker or grill for this "Pecan-Smoked Spicy Chicken" from "Jon Bonnell's Texas Favorites" (Gibbs Smith).

Pecan-Smoked Spicy Chicken

Serves 4

- 2 cups water
- 2 1/2 teaspoons cayenne pepper
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1 1/2 tablespoons salt
- 1 tablespoon honey
- 1 whole all-natural chicken, roughly 5 to 5 1/2 pounds
- 2 tablespoons Texas Red Dirt Rub Southwestern Blend, or similar Southwestern seasonings

Combine the water, pepper, garlic powder, salt, and honey in a pot and heat over the stove until completely dissolved together; let cool in the fridge.

Place the chicken in a 2-gallon zip-top freezer bag and pour in the brine. Force out as much air as possible, then seal the bag. Allow the chicken to soak in the refrigerator overnight, turning several times to ensure the brine reaches the entire bird. Remove the chicken from the bag the following day, drain off all of the brine and pat the bird dry with paper towels. Rub the bird well with the Southwestern Blend, even the inside of the cavity. Truss the bird with kitchen twine, pulling the legs and wings in tight to ensure it cooks evenly. Place the bird in a smoker with pecan chips and cook at 250 F until done, about 2 hours.

Gas grill alternative: Turn one burner on high and leave one burner off. Place a foil package of pecan wood chips over the hot side until they begin to smoke. Place the bird on the cool side, pull down the lid and allow to smoke. Turn the bird once in a while to ensure even cooking, and refresh the chips as needed to maintain a smoky environment inside your gas grill.

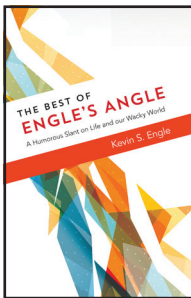

Ask Stewart

Hey Stewart,

When is the best time to plant a tree?

- Bob

In our area, Fall and Spring are good tree planting times. And getting the timing right can help give your tree a good start to life in its new home, so it can quickly establish and grow healthily. Knowing when and how to plant trees also prevents you from potentially having to labor carrying lots of

heavy watering cans, or juggling with hoses, to ensure that your precious tree stays alive during hot weather.

Trees purchased from a nursery, garden center, or online, are likely to come either bare-root, root-balled, or container-grown, and that will have an impact on when you plant the trees. Trees grown in containers are likely to be larger and more expensive, and they tend to be available year-round. Bare root trees are the cheapest option and are available in fall and winter. You can also get trees that are root-balled - where the trees have been grown in the ground and lifted - and these tend to be readily seen from fall through to spring.

Your soil type, as well as the local weather conditions, will also have an impact on what the ideal window is.

If you have heavy soil that holds a lot of water, then it would not be recommended to plant a tree after a period of heavy rainfall. Planting into a waterlogged spot will be of no benefit to the tree. Consider digging a test hole to see if it fills up with water - if there is water that pools at the bottom of the hole, then it is not a good time to plant the tree. If planting in the fall, be sure to dig the hole before the ground freezes.

Whether they are deciduous or evergreen trees, fall and spring are the two best times of year for planting bare root trees and root-balled trees. They are periods when the soil and weather is ideal for the tree to establish a root network quickly. And spring and fall also benefit the gardener, in terms of how much you will need to water the
