recruited representatives from our food pantry, daycare, preschool, caring outreach, and senior services to hand out promotional flyers to neighbors. Each ministry donated one candy laden vehicle. Other promotional activities in-

cluded church web site and Facebook notifications, public service announcements, signage, and newspaper bulletins. We did everything we could to get our neighbors involved," Steward said.

Trunk-or-Treat events have

morphed into one of the largest outreach efforts on any church calendar. Many churches will receive more non-churched people on their property during their afternoon Trunk-or-Treat event than at any other time during the year.

Jacquetta Owen, the event organizer, and president of Stephens City UMC, emphasized the importance of providing a safe and fun space for children and teens to celebrate Halloween. "This event was all about growing community and giving families a safe, festive venue for kids to dress up and collect treats," Owen said.

"We love seeing new faces attend every year. We enjoy having our neighbors here. This was an outstanding opportunity to approach Halloween with a positive spirit and share the festival fun and excitement with our fellow citizens in Stephens City. We wanted it to be a benevolent main street level church outreach that touched many lives in the neighborhood," Owen concluded.

Stephens City UMC pastor Bertina Westley said the overarching purpose of the occasion was to build trusting relationships with families so that they understand God loves them and that we are a caring church that glorifies Jesus Christ.

Camping For Hunger event to bring in food for winter

There are more than the usual number of folks in this community who are or will be needing some extra assistance with food and other necessities this winter, and enthusiastic volunteer bus campers who will be sleeping and taking in donations are helping by "Celebrating 16 years of throwing hunger under the bus!"

The collection effort benefits the Front Royal/Warren County Congregational Community Action (C-CAP) organization.

The Camping For Hunger bus will be at their 2024 site in the Royal Plaza Shopping Center near Rural King from Monday, November 18 through Saturday, November 23.

"Bring your canned goods, non-perishable food and monetary donations day or night OR drop and go at a food partner location around town," say the organizers of the event. "Suggested hours for food, cash or gift card donations are 9 a.m. - 5 p.m."

Items such as personal care, paper products, kid-friendly nutritious meals and snacks, extras like coffee, tea, laundry and cleaning products are also welcome.

More drop-off points can be found on the website of the hosts of the event, River 95.3 and WFTR/Fox Sports 1450,

members of Royal Broadcasting.

President of the broadcasting company, Andrew Shearer, commented, "For 16 years, the radio station staff and our neighbors and partners have stepped up to support those less fortunate and in need, particularly at the time of year when the holidays approach and the temperatures drop."

"It's important that we recognize the need is an on-going one and not just at this time of year."

"Since the first Camping event in 2008, donation totals have exceeded 204,300 pounds of food and supplies such as personal hygiene items and over \$152,500 in cash and gift cards. On average, the total amount of food and money collected each year provides approximately six to nine months' worth of food for C-CAP's pantry program, depending on the need."

Another main goal of the camping folks is to raise awareness of hunger in the northern Shenandoah Valley.

And, "ALL proceeds benefit Front Royal and Warren County," says C-CAP's Executive Director Joanne Koszyk, who pointed out the great need for food and monetary donations this year.

"More and more families came in for food this year," she said. "People are stressed financially and struggling to make ends meet. It has been differ-

ent because normally in the summer people don't need as much food. We have many homeless people and those living in motels and hotels, but there are also people with children who need more help.

She said the maximum number of clients was 39 people in one day this summer and today there were 30 and stressed that any donation large or small will help. "For example, one can of corn would provide a vegetable for a meal for one day."

Koszyk went on to describe more about the event.

"People on the bus are 95.3 radio station staff who sleep on there and our staff pitches in too," she said. "We'll stand outside the bus and take donations then hand it to them, so they don't have to get off and on. We will unload it at the end of the week."

"The staff at River 95.3 have been amazing and a huge source of support," Koszyk said, and added that oth-

ers have stepped up like students from Dominion Ridge Academy who collect food at their school in the "Stuff the Truck" enterprise to add to the total intake and help organize donations on the bus.

"So many other people have been supportive of us," continued Koszyk. "And all of our staff contribute by collecting and counting money. The bus is weighed at the beginning and then weighed at the end, so we know the poundage of food and know how we did."

C-CAP

Koszyk spoke about C-CAP's year-long activities at 400 Kendrick Lane (site of the former office of Avtex Fibers).

She said that they are a 100% volunteer organization, mission-driven, with 65 volunteers.

"We have board members of 10-12

who work hard and work closely as a team spreading the work out. We believe we have the happiest volunteers on the face of the earth."

They've been at the Kendrick Lane site for two years, and she says the place is perfect for them with plenty of parking and for children, a special area called Explorer's Corner with toys and children's books, is available. Donations of items for kids are always welcome.

"It's very difficult for people because they don't have enough money to get their entire food needs met and we want to stress that this is a local campaign to help your neighbors in need," she said. "We're concerned about the new year."

She added that the biggest group of people who need help right now are seniors and families with kids.

"Who knows what the prices of gas, home heating or electricity will be?" she asked, and gave an example of

how the addition of food can help with tough choices.

"If C-CAP can provide food, then if a child becomes sick at least the family can afford medicine and not have to choose between the two," she noted. "If we can keep them moving, that is our goal"

Other things that people can donate are cleaning products or personal hygiene, paper products like paper towels and toilet paper, and any kind of baby products.

If they know someone is unhoused,

they are provided with things that can be used without a kitchen like easy-open cans, shelf stable items, shelf stable milk, prepackaged meals, and canned meat. They also collect household supplies like pots and pans.

For those without transportation, the Front Royal Trolley stops at the Kendrick Lane site every hour so people can get there and back easily.

There's also a great new program for toddlers.

"Right now, we have a program called 'The Munch Bunch Crew,'" she

said. "Older school kids get some food at school but there has been a piece missing for toddlers."

With the grant funded program, pre-school kids get a bag of healthy snacks from the Community Foundation of the Northern Shenandoah Valley.

For dropping off donations, there are bins outside C-CAP for nonperishable items, and they have refrigerators and freezers inside to keep meat and other perishable food. People can donate meat as well, such as turkeys for

Thanksgiving.

Signal Knob poses for paint party portraits

Laura Corebello, local artist and teacher has been hosting paint parties for the last eight years and last month she celebrated the anniversary by inviting folks to her home/studio to showcase the prominent and ever-changing mysterious mountain, prominently visible when crossing the

two bridges just north of Front Royal, over the north and south forks of the Shenandoah River, and from many other spots in the surrounding area.

"The latest paint party was of the iconic view of Signal Knob. There is so much history right here in Front Royal and that particular mountain range holds part of that history. Everyone who came had some kind of connection to that mountain scene. They all

were excited to paint it," she said.

"I offer this experience once a month at my home/studio. I can't count the number of people who have attended these paint parties. It has to be well over a hundred, and many are return painters who have come to many of the parties. Some people have come many times over the years, and I can see a tremendous growth in their work," she continued. "I am so excited to have been able to share my painting skills with so many people throughout these years.

"I can't believe I counted over 60

parties that I have hosted at my home/studio in that time period. When I started this venture, I wanted to create a relaxed, stress-free, non-judgmental atmosphere where people can feel free to express themselves with painting, even if they have never painted before."

She said that she didn't know the history of the mountain when she moved here from New Jersey years ago, but since then has been fascinated with it and can see it from her deck in the winter when leaves are off the trees.

She did learn about its history, and the following is a small part of what she discovered.

Sources say, "Signal Knob, the northern peak of Massanutten Mountain, was used by Signal Corps in the American Civil War by both the Union and Confederate armies. The Confederates occupied it from 1862 to 1864. From Signal Knob, the Confederate Signal Corps could monitor Union troop movements and observe battles from Winchester to Fisher's Hill and beyond. They could also communicate using flags, lanterns, and telescopes to other stations at Ashby Gap, Burnt Springs, Harmony Hollow, and New Market Gap. Remains of Civil War era fortifications can still be seen around the area. "Signal Knob" National Park Service. (Wikipedia)

She went on to explain that her goal was to bring people together, make new friends and help them learn how to paint and to have them walk away feeling successful and proud of their work.

Also, this creates the opportunity for folks to bond with new people who join, then cheer each other on in this process, to offer a "no stress zone" to meet people in the community.

She announced on her website that she is repeating a painting formerly used of a colorfully connected sun and moon for the upcoming Halloween Party on October 19th, and she predicts that it will be a lot of fun. This one is sold-out but there may be one seat left for someone, so message her on Facebook if interested. For information on future parties, check on

She said that she recently collaborated with Eka Kapiotis, an expert in meditation, and had a painting/meditation retreat. "This was very exciting to do, and we plan on doing another in the near future," she said. "Anyone over 18 is invited to be a part of the Paint Club and I always welcome new members to paint with us."

Corebello has a long history in art education. She was a teacher in New Jersey for 15 years, and then in Frederick County at Apple Pie Ridge Elementary for seven years.

"I love it here," she said. "I was in-

spired by the mountains of Front Royal. This place brought out my creativity like no other place has done."

"We have such beautiful scenes right here in Front Royal. We sometimes take for granted the beauty around us," she said.

She has an idea for a contest, still in the planning stage, that will invite participants to submit their favorite scene of the town of Front Royal and surrounding areas. The winning photo will be used at a future paint party, and the person who wins will get a free paint session.

Laura continued her basic biogra-

phy to give some information about who she is, for folks who don't know about her and her work.

PECAN PIE MAKES A PERFECT DESSERT THIS THANKSGIVING

Though no dessert is off limits on Thanksgiving, pie is a particularly popular option on Turkey Day. With that in mind, those tasked with crafting something for dessert this Thanksgiving can consider the following recipe for "Pecan Pie" courtesy of Lines+Angles.

Pecan Pie
Makes 8 servings

- 1 9-inch unbaked frozen deep dish pie shell, thawed
- 1 1/2 cups pecans, coarsely chopped
- 3 eggs, lightly beaten

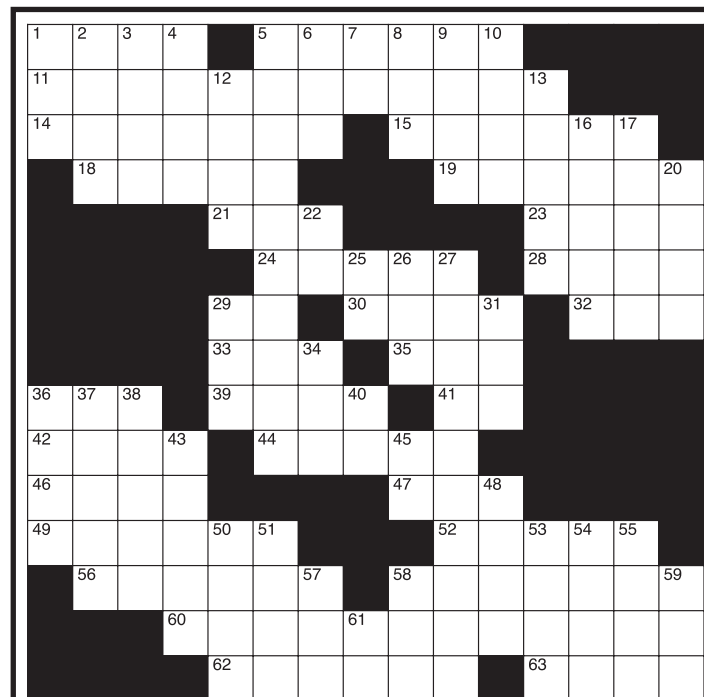

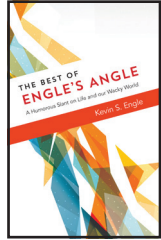

the custard-like fruit is an ideal spoonable dessert. You won't find them in the supermarket — but some plant breeders are trying to change that.

In the wild, they grow from northern Florida to southern Ontario, tolerating a broad range of conditions and often spreading to form thickets. They are the only temperate genus of the otherwise tropical custard apple family — a traveler that made its way north long ago and, farmers hope, might be a way reduce their risk as climate change increasingly threatens their crops.

Pawpaws are vulnerable to snap frosts, like apple and peach trees. But unlike them, pawpaws have the unusual ability to produce more flowers if they lose their first set of blooms to a cold snap.

Pawpaws have developed a cult following among some backyard farmers and horticulturists, for whom the idea of restoring native fruit and nut trees

to an overheating planet is urgent. Now the fruit's resilience is giving it a wider audience in places where it wasn't common before, among both hobbyists and those who make a living growing fruit.

the home and were initially met by a man who opened and then closed the door on them. After repeated knocking, a woman, who was not a resident, exited and spoke with deputies. She complied with their request, but the man who first answered the door attempted to obstruct the deputies' search. He was subsequently detained and charged with obstructing law enforcement.

Inside the residence, deputies found the wanted individual hiding under a bed. When officers began issuing commands for him to surrender, the man indicated he was armed, causing deputies to withdraw to a safe distance in the hallway. From this vantage point, they observed the man holding a firearm and repeatedly threatening to take his own life. Deputies attempted to de-escalate the situation but backed away after hearing a single gunshot.

Out of caution, the surrounding area was temporarily secured, and traffic was restricted until the situation was fully assessed. Special operations teams, including the SWAT and Drone Units, were called to the scene. Drone operators deployed an indoor airframe to search the residence safely, eventually locating the suspect deceased from a self-inflicted gunshot wound. The SWAT team then confirmed and secured the scene.

Authorities emphasize that the incident was contained to the residence, and there was no ongoing threat to the public.

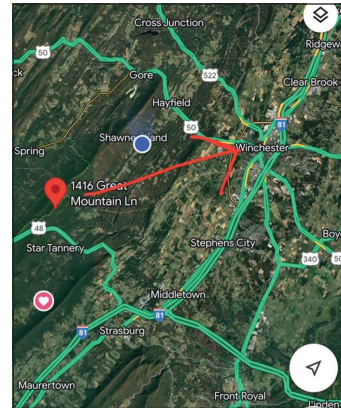

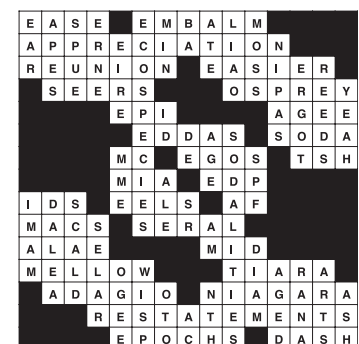
