





GINGERBREAD TAKES THE CAKE



Plenty of foods are associated with Christmastime, but none perhaps as familiar as gingerbread. Although the slightly spicy and warming tang of gingerbread often is enjoyed in cookie form or baked into panels used to create gingerbread houses, the spice combination of ginger, cloves and cinnamon can impart a delicious flavor to cakes as well.

This holiday season, whip up this recipe for "Tender Gingerbread Cake" from "Butter, Flour, Sugar, Joy" (Sourcebooks) by Danielle Kartes.

Tender Gingerbread Cake *Yield: 1 cake*

- 1 cup packed muscovado sugar (dark brown works great)
- 1/2 cup plus 2 tablespoons butter, softened
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 2 eggs, room temperature
- 1/4 cup plain full-fat Greek or plain yogurt
- 13/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves
- 1/4 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1/4 teaspoon apple pie spice
- 1 cup hot water
- 3/4 cup molasses

Garnishes

1/2 cup confectioners' sugar1 cup pomegranate arilsPreheat oven to 350 F. Line a

9-by-9-inch cake pan with parchment paper.

Cream the sugar, butter, and vanilla on low speed, 3 minutes. Add the eggs one at a time and mix until just incorporated, then scrape down the sides of the bowl and gently fold the yogurt into the batter

In a separate bowl, whisk the flour, baking powder, salt, and spices together.

In a third bowl, mix the hot water and molasses together.

Now mix the dry ingredients into the batter in 3 additions, alternating with the hot molasses water. Do not overmix.

Pour the batter into your lined pan and bake 25 to 30 minutes until the cake is well baked. Allow the gingerbread to cool, then dust with confectioners' sugar and pomegranate arils. This cake is also lovely with cream cheese icing! Serve and enjoy.







Making Christmas Pudding is an English family tradition



Sondra Johnson, from England, grew up with the tradition of making traditional Christmas Pudding with her family.

As the daughter of two activeduty members of the armed forces during World War II (my mother was in the Royal Air Force, my father the United States Army), I was born in England and retained strong ties to my English ancestors. I remember my grandmother pulled a cake out of her sideboard and pouring some kind of alcohol over it (I knew by the smell), but because kids are kids, I wasn't curious enough to ask any questions. Except the obvious: When do we get to eat it? And the answer was "Christmas." And Christmas was a long time away.

But as I grew up, I learned about English Christmas "pudding" and

its relationship to Stir-Up Sunday.

"Stir-up Sunday" was an informal term in Anglican churches for the last Sunday before the season of Advent. It gets its name from the beginning of the Collect appointed for the day in the 1928 Book of Common Prayer, which begins with the words, "Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people."

Centuries ago, it became associated with the custom of making the Christmas pudding on that day.

Traditionally, families gathered together in the kitchen of their homes to mix and steam Christmas pudding on Stir-up Sunday.

Parents taught their children how to mix ingredients for the pudding. Everyone took turns to stir the pudding mix. The recipe called for thirteen ingredients, representing Christ and His apostles, and family members stirred from east to west to honor the Wise Men who went in that direction to Bethlehem.

One of the earliest recipes, called Plum Pudding, was written down in a book called A Collection of the above Three Hundred Receipts in Cookery, Physick and Surgery. It was not unusual for old English cookbooks to include recipes for caring for the sick.

Throughout the years, the con-

coction has been called different things. Plum Pudding, Christmas Pudding, and Christmas Cake are probably the most common.

In some households, silver coins are added to the pudding mix. It is believed that finding a coin brings good luck.

It can also cause choking or broken teeth so be careful if you choose to do that!

Traditional Christmas Pudding is more like a heavy cake than what you might think of as a pudding. It is made with raisins and other dried fruit and flavored with brandy. Sometimes it contains nuts as well. It is steamed and then kept for several weeks in a cool cupboard and regularly a few ounces of brandy are poured over it until Christmas Day.

At the end of Christmas lunch or dinner, the pudding is garnished with holly and doused again in brandy which is then lit. Not only does this create a spectacle, it also flavors the pudding. After the flames go out, the pudding is cut into small slices (a little goes a long way as it is very rich). It is then served with brandy custard, brandy butter or cream.

(Please note, holly could make you very sick and should be removed before cutting or serving. Even better, use artificial holly instead!)

If you've seen A Christmas Carol, you might remember the Bob Cratchit family serving the flaming Christmas pudding and being ever so joyful as they cheered the very small cake they would be sharing among so many.

Because I'm always pushing my English heritage on my children and grandchildren, I make my own version of the Christmas pudding and I serve it at Christmas to less than rave reviews (it is, after all, a fruitcake)!

I begin it on "Stir Up Sunday"











just as my ancestors did. And I've always done it alone, or with my husband, because we're the only two in the house now.

But not many years ago I decided not to begin it on Stir Up Sunday, but rather on Thanksgiving, which usually falls very close to Stir Up Sunday.

I gathered all the ingredients and set them out. Each person had a chance to add something to the bowl and after that everyone took a turn stirring, from oldest to youngest. It was fun and memorable – at least for me!

My recipe has evolved through the years and makes the pudding a little more cakelike. And though it certainly contains enough brandy, we don't set it on fire.

You can find many recipes for Christmas Pudding online, which is probably better than using my recipe because I tend to be one of those cooks who just "sort of" measures.

So do your own research and give it a go; it's a fun project. Just remember to keep pouring on the brandy. That's what keeps the cake from rotting in your cupboard of course!

Editor's note: Included is a recipe for English Christmas Pudding found online.

For the pudding

- 50g blanched almonds
- 2 large Bramley cooking apples
- 200g box candied peel (in large pieces) or all citron if you can find it
- 1 whole nutmeg (you'll use three quarters of it)
- 1kg raisins
- 140g plain flour
- 100g soft fresh white breadcrumbs
- · 100g light muscovado sugar

crumbled if it looks lumpy

- 3 large eggs
- 2 tbsp brandy or cognac, plus extra to light the pudding
- 250g packet butter taken straight from the fridge For the brandy and ginger butter
- 175g unsalted butter softened
- · grated zest of half an orange
- 5 tbsp icing sugar
- 4 tbsp brandy or cognac
- 2 pieces of stem ginger finely chopped

Method

• step 1

Get everything prepared for the pudding. Chop the almonds coarsely. Peel, core and chop the cooking apples. Sharpen your knife and chop the candied peel. (You can chop the almonds and apples in a food processor, but the peel must be done by hand.) Grate three quarters of the nutmeg (sounds a lot but it's correct).

• step 2

Mix the almonds, apples, candied peel, nutmeg, raisins, flour, breadcrumbs, light muscovado sugar, eggs and 2 tbsp brandy or cognac in a large bowl.

• step 3

Holding the butter in its wrapper, grate a quarter of it into the bowl, then stir everything together. Repeat until all the butter is grated, then stir for 3-4 mins – the mixture is ready when it subsides slightly after each stir. Ask the family to stir too, and get everyone to make a wish.

step 4

Generously butter two 1.2 litre bowls and put a circle of baking parchment in the bottom of each. Pack in the pudding mixture. Cover with a double layer of baking parchment, pleating it to allow for expansion, then tie with string (keep the paper in place with a rubber band while tying). Trim off any excess paper.

• step 5

Now stand each bowl on a large sheet of foil and bring the edges up over the top, then put another sheet of foil over the top and bring it down underneath to make a double package (this makes the puddings watertight). Tie with more string and make a handle for easy lifting in and out of the pan.

• step 6

Boil or oven steam the puddings for 8 hours, topping up with water as necessary. Remove from the pan and leave to cool overnight. When cold, discard the messy wrappings and re-wrap in new baking parchment, foil and string. Store in a cool, dry place until Christmas.

• step 7

To make the brandy butter, cream the butter with the orange zest and icing sugar. Gradually beat in the brandy or cognac and chopped stem ginger. Put in a small bowl, fork the top attractively and put in the fridge to set. The butter will keep for a week in the fridge, or it can be frozen for up to six weeks.

• step 8

On Christmas Day, boil or oven steam for 1 hr. Unwrap and turn it out. If desired, to flame, warm 3-4 tbsp brandy in a small pan, pour it over the pudding and set light to it.

Sure Carolyn,

A Christmas tree is a decorated tree, usually an evergreen conifer such as spruce, pine, or fir or an artificial tree of similar appearance, associated with the celebration of Christmas. The modern Christmas tree was developed in early modern Germany (where it is today called Weihnachtsbaum or Christbaum).

The tree was traditionally decorated with roses made of colored paper, apples, wafers, tinsel, and sweetmeats. In the 18th century, it began to be illuminated by candles which were ultimately replaced by Christmas lights after the advent of electrification.

The Christmas tree became very common in the United States in the early nineteenth century. The first mention of the Christmas tree in American literature was in a story in the 1836 edition of The Token and Atlantic Souvenir, titled "New Year's Day," by Catherine Maria Sedgwick, where she tells the story of a German maid decorating her mistress's tree.

The TV special A Charlie Brown

Christmas (1965) was influential on the pop culture surrounding the Christmas tree. The term Charlie Brown Christmas Tree is now used to describe any poor-looking or malformed little tree, usually the last one to be sold.

Each year, 33 to 36 million Christmas trees are produced in America, and many people like to use live trees which can be planted. Here are some tips for a successful planting:

- 1. Limit the amount of time your tree is indoors -- 7-10 days is ideal. Daily watering is necessary to keeping your tree healthy.
- 2. Move your tree to a sheltered outdoor space to allow your tree to acclimate back to the cold. Continue watering it daily. Choose an open, sunny planting spot. Research the type of tree you have and its growth potential.
- 3. Dig the hole as early as possible in the season. If you've waited too long to dig and the ground is already frozen, try pouring boiling water onto the spot and then digging. Dig wide but not deep. Using a shovel, dig a hole twice as wide as the size of the root ball to give the roots a chance to spread. But don't go any deeper than the height of the root
- 4. Remove root ball coverings. Place the tree in the hole. Fill the hole back in. Tamp the soil gently, but don't pack it in tightly. Stake your tree to keep it
- 5. Water the newly planted tree. You do not need to use any sort of fertilizer just plain water will do.
- 6. Mulch around the tree. Add a couple inches of mulch around the base of the tree as an insulating layer.
- 7. Monitor soil moisture. If your winter conditions are dry, occasionally water the tree to keep moisture near the


