

charges Abdulrhaman Al Duias, age and address unavailable, with FOUR counts. COUNTS ONE through FOUR: In the County of Warren, Abdulrhaman Al Duias did unlawfully and feloniously conspire with intent to sell or distribute marijuana while upon any property open to public use

within 1,000 feet of such school property in violation of the Code of Virginia. Dates of the offenses were on or about May 15, July 17, July 25 and September 6, 2024.



The next time you're thinking of something different, interesting, fun and entertaining, consider Strasburg. Only 12 miles south of Front Royal, either traveling on Strasburg Road or Rte. 66 and I-81, the charming town has a lot to offer.

There are so many varied and interesting things to do there that can be included in the usual familiar activities in one's hometown, especially during fall and heading into end of the year holidays.

For example, "Pumpkin time" this year, involves the Jack O' Lantern Jamboree Halloween Light Tour from October 15-31,

a Home Decorating Contest from October 16-31 with a deadline to enter on October 11.

activities add to the richness of autumn.

- The Strasburg Presbyterian Church Pumpkin Patch is open daily from October 12-31, featuring games, kids' activities, and a bake sale.

- At the Strasburg Farmers Market, residents can find pumpkins locally. They operate on Saturdays in September and October.

- For Halloween, Trick-or-treating takes place in the town of Strasburg on October 31 from 5 - 8 p.m.

For other wonderful things to do in Strasburg throughout the year, the Strasburg Visitor and Information Center is a good place to stop to find more of what the area has to see and do.

One fascinating place for folks to spend some time is near the Deer Rapids Boat Landing. High above the North Fork of the Shenandoah River, just outside of Strasburg is the historic Deer Rapids swinging suspension bridge. Walking across it takes an adventurous attitude, but it's worth the slight adrenaline thrill.

While maneuvering across the swaying walkway, you can gaze out across the fields and river, check out wild turkeys running in packs through the grasses, maintain your balance (holding on to the thick wire railing is a great idea!) and feel the breeze coming up from the water, especially refreshing on a hot summer afternoon.

Padlocks are scattered along the railing as couples have attached them as a romantic gesture similar to carving initials on trees.

Before the concrete bridge was replaced a few years ago, this footbridge was necessary because vehicles could not cross the old low-water bridge when the river flooded over it during heavy storms. Residents of Deer Rapids were stranded except for crossing on foot.


Even after the new highway bridge was built, it flooded after a fierce storm in 2011.

This low water bridge is three miles south of Strasburg off Rte. 644 (Funk Road), providing a

gravel boat ramp for a great launch point to float to the Strasburg Town Park a mere 5.6 miles downstream.

Then there's Strasburg Town Park with a concrete boat launch suitable for kayaks, canoes and shallow aluminum boats. The very family friendly access point is great for people with children, including a big gravel parking lot with port-a-johns next to the river.

To find out much more, visit the Visitor Center, open from 10

a.m. – 4 p.m. daily. Information includes descriptions of the walking trails that take folks through thick woods along .25-, .5-, and 1-mile distances, with peeks into small caverns along the paths.

Along with wonderful restaurants, Shenandoah River access, community activities, a historic district, musical events and fun fall activities for families, there's the Strasburg Riverwalk.

Located along the Shenandoah River it begins at the Town Park. The .9 mile gravel walk offers beautiful views of the river and

the face of the Massanutten Mountain Range called Signal Knob and ends at Strasburg High School (Ram Drive).

The North Fork of the Shenandoah River is also easily accessed at Strasburg Town Park. A boat landing and gravel parking lot are available for people wanting to float the river on kayaks, tubes, canoes, and very shallow aluminum boats. This is a great area to float to from the Deer Rapids access point, approximately five miles

upstream. If floating downstream, please be cautious of a dangerous dam about five miles from Strasburg Town Park.

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services (VDACS) has confirmed the detection of the invasive box tree moth, Cydalima perspectalis, in the city of Winchester.

In July and August, VDACS inspectors discovered and treated box tree moth at multiple sites in Clarke, Frederick, and Loudoun counties. Officials said surveys will continue to determine the extent of the populations in these areas.

Box tree moth is native to East Asia and has become a significant pest in Europe, where boxwood is native. The insect pest can cause extensive damage to boxwood (Buxus species) plants, and heavy infestations can completely defoliate host plants. Left untreated, the moth can kill boxwood. VDACS will provide treatment for boxwood plants if box tree moth is confirmed. Officials said early detection and rapid response are critical for managing newly introduced plant pests.

Property owners and members of the public are encouraged to report suspected box tree moth infestations or damage to boxwood plants using VDACS' Invasive Species Reporting Tool.

Va State Police make arrest in 1998 cold case

Virginia State Police is announcing a breakthrough in the cold case investigation of the 1998 murder of Sylena Jo Dalton.

On Friday, Sept. 26, 2025, agents with the Virginia State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigations Culpeper Field Office arrested Daniel E. Pompell, 56, of Culpeper, Va., charging him with one count of murder. Pompell was taken into custody without incident. The arrest marks a major step in the

overdue closure to the family of Sylene Jo Dalton," said Virginia State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigations Culpeper Field Office Captain John Defilippi. "We are thankful for all the hard work agents and analysts put into this case to make this arrest possible. We also truly appreciate the cooperation and coordination with Shenandoah County Commonwealth's Attorney Elizabeth Cooper and her office in moving this case forward."

Shenandoah County Commonwealth's Attorney Elizabeth Cooper stated, "Virginia State Police has tirelessly pursued justice for the death of Sylene Jo Dalton. My office is prepared to continue in this effort and ensure justice is served on behalf of the victim and her family."

On July 27, 1998, a friend found

Sylene Jo Dalton, 20, of Strasburg, Va., stabbed to death inside her apartment in Strasburg. Dalton's 10-week-old daughter, Allyson Kathleen Dalton, was also missing and has never been located.

Pompell is the father of Allyson Dalton.

The Shenandoah County Commonwealth's Attorney's Office will be prosecuting the case.

Man dies after arrest, transport to RSW Regional Jail

Warren County, VA — On September 25, 2025, at approximately 12:03 a.m., deputies with the Warren County Sheriff's Office (WCSO) initiated a traffic stop at the corner

of North Royal Avenue and 1st Street in Front Royal for an expired state inspection.

During the stop, a WCSO narcotic detection K9 conducted a free air sniff of the vehicle and had a positive alert to the presence of narcotics. Deputies located suspected crack cocaine inside the vehicle and placed the driver, identified as D'Andre Christopher Lawrence, 28, of Front Royal, under arrest for possession of a Schedule I/II controlled substance.

Mr. Lawrence was transported to the Rappahannock, Shenandoah, Warren (RSW) Regional Jail where he appeared before the magistrate and was held without bond on a felony drug charge.

While in the Intake area of RSW, jail personnel observed signs that Lawrence was experiencing a medical emergency suspected to be related to an overdose. RSW security and medical personnel responded immediately, administering lifesaving measures immediately while Warren County Fire and Rescue was dispatched.

Lawrence was transported to Warren Memorial Hospital, where he was pronounced deceased.

While the investigation is ongoing, both agencies recognize that this incident involves the loss of a young life. Mr. Lawrence had family and loved ones who are directly impacted, and officials ask the community to respect their privacy during this difficult time.

The Warren County Sheriff's Office and RSW Regional Jail stated that

they operate under strict legal and policy frameworks. Incidents such as this are met with immediate internal and external reviews to ensure that all actions are consistent with law, professional standards, and their obligation to those in custody.

As part of this process, the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner is conducting a full examination to determine the official cause and manner of death. Those findings will guide the ongoing investigation and internal reviews.

Virginia State Police is investigating a fatal single vehicle crash that occurred Friday (Sept. 19, 2025) at 2:00 p.m. on Interstate 81 northbound at Exit 291 in Shenandoah County.

A 1997 Peterbuilt tractor-trailer was travelling northbound on Interstate 81 and taking the exit ramp for Exit 291 when it went off of the left side of the
